

## About Catlin Park

This 333-acre park is a fascinating blend of pine and deciduous forests, prairie grasslands, rugged ravines, meandering streams, and an abundance of wildlife. You'll encounter deer, wild turkeys, various bird species, squirrels, and rabbits. The park boasts a well-organized trail network comprising 14 distinct trails and numerous connectors that wind through its diverse habitats, including streams and ponds.

Catlin Park lies at the junction between the Grand Prairie natural division and the upper Mississippi/Illinois River bottomlands. Catlin Park is also home to unique plant species, including the once-plentiful Chinkapin Oak and the rare Green Dragon. Keen-eyed visitors might even spot an orchid or two.

For equestrians, there are miles of groomed trails to explore. The LaSalle County Park Department has thoughtfully provided a dedicated horse trailer parking lot and a spacious 120 x 160 horse arena right here at Catlin Park.

The park offers four covered pavilions equipped with picnic tables, grills, ample parking, and clean restrooms. A fifth covered pavilion is nestled within the trail system.



### Park Hours

Summer, May 1 - October 31: 9am - 7pm

Winter, November 1 - April 30: 9am - 3pm

### Park Rules and Safety

Groups of 25 or more must receive advance permission from the site manager.

Visitors shall conduct themselves in a manner that maintains the peace and refrain from activities that interfere with the normal, safe use of the parks.
